- Community enabled engagement

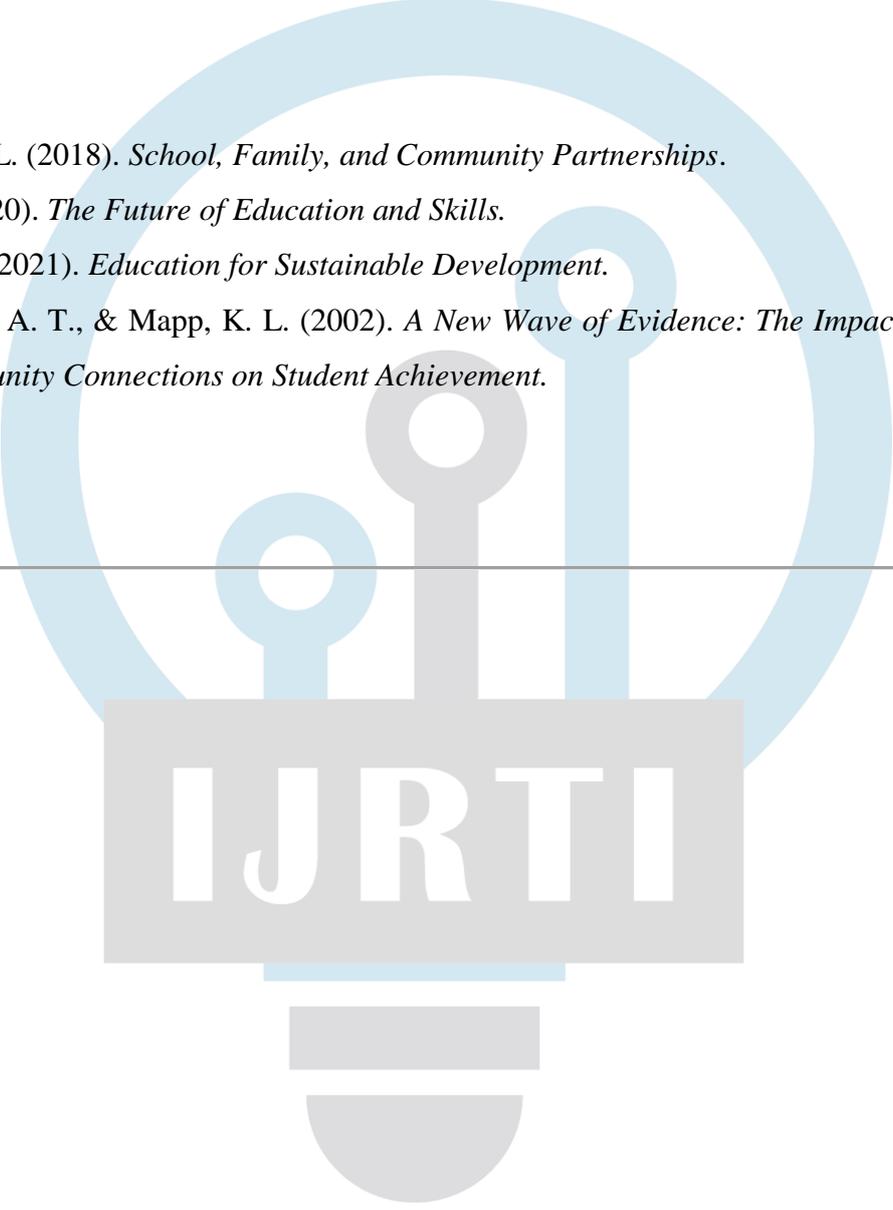
8. Conclusion
